TRAFFIC SAFETY



A reminder to all community members that the speed limit during school hours is 40 km on Arthurs Seat Rd. In this week's newsletter, I have included an outline of our traffic management strategy. For the benefit and safety of all members of our school community, it is extremely important that you strictly adhere to the following safeguards we have in place.

Please carefully read through each statement below and strictly adhere to our traffic safety strategy.

- ◆ **The teachers car park at the front of the school (where the buses park) is not a pickup or drop off zone.** Children being dropped off by the buses in this area and the staff are not expecting cars to be travelling in and out at this time!
- ◆ **The car park outside the school stadium is not to be used as a pickup or drop off zone.** Again we have children playing in the playground who are not expecting cars to be driving up and down the side driveway or into their playing space.
- ◆ **The car park outside the school stadium can however be used** by the after school and before school patrons for drop off and pickup only or for special after school hours events.
- ◆ The **driving speed for vehicles** using the stadium driveway, the stadium car park and the lower sandy car park, is **walking pace** at all times.
- ◆ **No cars** are to enter the school grounds during **school hours**.
- ◆ In the interest of public relations, please ensure the neighbouring driveways are clear at all times.
- ◆ An adult must escort all students being picked up at the lower sandy car park to their car. **No child is to enter the lower sandy car park unsupervised.**
- ◆ The drive through is not to be used as a carpark and all users must be patient and stay in one line when entering the drop off lane. No cutting in is permitted and double parking is not acceptable.
- ◆ Children and adults must use the school crossing at all times.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSION FUND (CSEF) - School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. CSEF provided by the Victorian Government assists **eligible families** to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per student is: \$125 for primary school students and \$225 for secondary school students. A flyer and application form will be sent home with all students outlining further details for eligible families. Application forms to be returned by Friday 22nd February with a copy of your eligible Concession Card.

2018 SCHOOL COUNCIL ROLES

On Monday, the school community will receive notification in relation to the 2019 School Council election process. All government schools in Victoria have a school council, a legally constituted body given powers to set the key directions of a school within statewide guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

Being a member on school council does require commitment, time and a hands on approach.

This year there will again have a number of projects earmarked for school councillors to action and oversee.

We would be particularly interested in a school council member who could offer skills and enthusiasm in following areas:

- √ An interest in helping to develop our external and internal environments.
- √ An interest in further building our positive school culture to promote community pride and participation in events. Assist in overseeing school events, and increasing event participation and targeted marketing.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION HOW TO REPORT YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

In the interest of student safety and wellbeing, the Department of Education has mandated **for all enrolled students in a school setting, to be accounted for, by 10am each school day.**

What do you need to do to report an absence?

We ask all parent/caregivers to use the Sentral Parent Portal to report all absences on the day of an absence or for advance absences. This will allow our administration staff to quickly and efficiently track student absences, each morning, and meet the 10 am deadline. **If you are a new family to the school, you will receive your family key code today, via letter.**

On the day of an absence, the parent portal is to be used. The parent portal is also too be used when reporting an absence in advance. Can you please let your child's teacher know of advanced absences in order for them to prepare a home learning plan prior to the absence.

A text will be sent to you if your child's absence is not reported on the Sentral Parent Portal, before 10am, on the day of absence.

When you receive an absence notification, do not respond to the text. Instead, please report the unexplained absence using the Sentral Parent Portal.

Your correct contact details are essential for this system to work.

Please contact the office if your details have changed or if you need any further clarification in relation to reporting a student absence.

RHCS WELLBEING NEWS


Dear Parents and friends,

I hope you all had a wonderful break over the summer and enjoyed this time with your children. Welcome back to another exciting year up here at Red Hill Consolidated School and a very special welcome to all of our new families. I've met quite a few of our new families and our new children seem to have settled in well. I'm especially impressed with our 2019 Prep children who have started off the year in great form. I have visited their rooms on most days and they are all very calm, happy and already showing beautiful manners, well done mums and dads.

I have also dropped in to all of our other classes and have noticed how settled they all are and how quickly students have adapted back to the school routine. They seem very well behaved and focused on their learning. There's also a real sense of calm in the playground during our recess and lunch breaks, and of course lots of fun and smiles.

Speaking of lunch breaks, our **Lunchtime Clubs** are ready to kick off next week. I've attached a copy of the Lunchtime Club roster for you to pin up at home and encourage. These clubs provide an alternative to the playground, which can be a daunting place for some students. Lots of our students attend clubs to make new friends, but some just attend because they are lots of fun.

If you're struggling to get your little ones to bed earlier on school nights after such a long break, I'd encourage you to trial the **Smiling Minds** App. This app is full of some great mindful meditations, including an entire section on getting to sleep. Teachers at Red Hill Consolidated School regularly use mindfulness in their classrooms as a way of refocusing and training our kids to catch their wandering thoughts and improve concentration, and then hopefully learning. But regular **mindfulness practices** have many other benefits, and can really help children calm down after a busy day and get settled for bed.....sometimes.



Tuesday this week was Safer Internet Day and the theme this year was **"Together For A Better Internet."** Most classes discussed and took part in activities to develop an understanding of how to be a safe and responsible digital citizen. I spent some time with one of our Grade 2 classes on Tuesday and heard all about their online habits. They could also tell me all about the sort of rules they have at home when using technology. It was so pleasing to hear that in most cases, Internet enabled devices were not allowed in bedrooms and screen time is restricted and monitored. Cybersafety experts stress the importance of keeping technology (including internet capable game consoles) out of bedrooms from an early age. If devices are used in a shared space at home, not only can parents better monitor content and usage, but children are at a decreased risk of online bullying and grooming. I would strongly urge all families to take this opportunity to develop an agreed upon set of rules around using technology at home. Rules should cover when children can use technology, how long they can use it for, where they can use devices and of course what they are allowed to do online.

Our Grade 5 students will be investigating responsible digital citizenship all term long as part of their Learning Exploration's Big Idea **"Responsible digital citizens understand that actions have consequences."** They kicked things off on Tuesday, developing pledges to be safe, respectful and responsible when online. I'll be sure to share some of their findings in upcoming newsletters.



I am still awaiting a number of families to return their **2019 Bus Applications**. It is a legal requirement to complete these forms annually, and failure to do so may result in your child losing his/her seat. These were distributed last year to all bus travellers, but new forms can be picked up from the office. Can all families please ensure that we have your correct permanent schedule, and any alterations are reported to the office before 2:30pm on the day of the change. Older children can do this by filling out a bus note, or parents can call the office and leave a message on our bus hotline. This process is instrumental in getting our buses off on time in the afternoon.

Finally this week, a big thankyou to Red Hill CFA members Darrell and Sam, who briefed and trained our staff on how best to protect our school if threatened by a fire. We also conducted our very first emergency evacuation drill with the children last Friday.

As we are a **Code Red school**, we conduct these drills regularly to ensure everyone know what to do in the case of an emergency and we can review and improve our procedures. You'll be pleased to know that the students responded perfectly and our evacuation was calm, orderly and efficient.



The next big day on the well-being calendar is **The National Day Of Action Against Bullying and Violence**, which we celebrate on Friday the 15th of March. Watch this space for more details. Looking forward to a brilliant year. Have a wonderful week.

We would like to start this year by welcoming all of the new families who have joined the Red Hill Consolidated School community. The school year has started with fantastic energy and outstanding focus in our classrooms. The students have settled quickly into their new classes and we would like to congratulate our entire staff team on the work they put into ensuring this happens. Over the holiday period our teachers were in preparing their classrooms, organising displays and book labels, reading student files and preparing thoroughly for the start of the school year. Their efforts are above those expected in schools and truly contribute to making Red Hill a great learning community.

We have begun the year with some very exciting Learning Explorations; students are looking carefully at their Big Idea's and expanding their understanding of themselves and the world around them through these.

Prep – “People make choices that affect themselves and others.”

Grade 2 – “We make decisions each day that affect ourselves and others.”

Grade 3 – “Industries produce needs and wants for consumers.”

Grade 6 – “Throughout history the decisions of Australian governments have had consequences for indigenous people.”

If any parents in our community have knowledge or expertise that would enhance our Learning Explorations we encourage you to contact us. We love to get parents involved in the fantastic learning that is happening at Red Hill Consolidated.

At present, teachers are working to develop relationships with their new classes and set their expectations for the year. Classes are developing their classroom agreements and identifying the behaviours that will be displayed by both the learners and teachers. For the first few weeks, as staff get to know their new students, there will be minimal homework, consisting mainly of regular home reading.

THE ROLE OF THE CLASS PARENT REPRESENTATIVE

At Red Hill Consolidated School, we are very fortunate to have an amazing community of students, parents and teachers coupled with a local community that consistently supports us.

One of the important roles we invite parents to undertake each year is the Class Parent Representative. The role of Class Parent Representative is important and acts as a line of communication between the teachers and the parents. It is not meant to be a big job, however it is an important part of our overall school communication strategy and integral to the development of a strong school community. At Red Hill Consolidated School, it is particularly important to have effective communication, given we have such a large percentage of children coming to and from school each day via buses. We want our parents to be regularly in touch with school life and to be engaged members of the school community. Please see below a detailed overview of the Class Parent Representative's role within the school.

THE ROLE OF THE CLASS PARENT REPRESENTATIVE

The role of the Class Parent Rep is to liaise between parents and the class teacher and to strongly encourage parent participation by regularly communicating school events and highlighting the benefits of being involved for both parents and students.

EXPECTATIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- At the start of the year, Class Parent Reps attend an initial information meeting and catch up. (date to be confirmed)
- Class Contact Lists - The teacher will send out a notice to parents requesting their approval to have their name, email address and phone number on the class contact list. The school will then collate a master list for the parent rep to send out to all class parents.
- Rosters - Check to see if your class teacher would like any assistance with filling helper roles.
- Canteen - If needed, rallying the class parents to ensure your class has enough parents for the canteen to run effectively - Each class is responsible for 2 canteen days a year
- Special Events - Assist in communicating special events during the course of the year and encouraging everyone to take part in these community building opportunities (e.g. Art Red Hill, Cross Country, Working Bees, Disco etc)
- Liaison Role - Make contact and welcome any new families transferring in during the course of the year to your class.
- Social Role - This is not an expectation but again, further strengthening the school community and spirit it would be fabulous if reps were able to arrange a morning or afternoon tea for class parents to meet. This includes Prep up to Grade 6. Often reps have also organised a park play during the holidays for the children to stay in touch. These events are especially important in the younger grades as children are still finding their confidence at school and this can help build friendships groups.

This is a fun role and ensures you really feel part of the school community. Your children will love your involvement and the knowledge you have about 'their' school.
