Our 2018 Art Red Hill Exhibition, held early next term, will be the first major event and fundraiser for the school year. It is fantastic to have parents volunteering to head up the various categories and parents offering to assist in many other roles connected to the exhibit. RHCS School Council approved the allocation of the ARH fundraising profits on Tuesday evening. We aim to assign \$40,000 of ARH funds towards making improvements in the Lower Sandy playground and towards the purchase of new stage curtains, in the school hall. Congratulations to all families who have been selling the ARH raffle tickets. This will immediately put your family in the draw for some terrific prizes, which the children seem very excited about. Over the holidays, it could be a perfect opportunity to sell your tickets to extended family and friends and to encourage them to come to our ARH exhibit.
