Dear Parents and Friends

As many of you are aware, Leanne Marshall's secondment to The Department has been extended. She has now been appointed the Acting Senior Education Improvement Leader (SEIL) for the Kingston district. I speak with Leanne most days and she is enjoying this opportunity but is looking forward to returning to Red Hill Consolidated School. Leanne will return in the last week of this term. I would like to thank and acknowledge Joanne Barnes, who filled in as Acting Principal whilst I was on long service leave for the final two weeks of May. She did a brilliant job in this role.

I am very happy to formally announce some very exciting news for Red Hill Consolidated School. The Victorian Government has allocated \$3.2 million in capital works funding to refurbish and upgrade our buildings, learning spaces and bathrooms. Local Member of Parliament Chris Brayne visited our school earlier this week to tour the areas identified as requiring this upgrade. It is also anticipated that Victorian Premier, Daniel Andrews will visit Red Hill Consolidated School in the coming weeks. The first step for us is to begin working closely with the Victorian Building Authority and the Regional Office to complete an Asset Management Plan (AMP) in preparation for consultation with the appointed architect. This is an enormous win for our school community.

Speaking of building upgrades, our Grade 5/6 buildings are nearing completion. The handover date of June 19 may need to be pushed back a week or two given the severe weather we have experienced over the past three weeks. Most external work is now complete and contractors are now turning their attention to landscaping the areas around these new buildings. We are really happy with the look and design of these classrooms and can't wait to get in and make use of the cleverly designed learning spaces.

The first of our prep classrooms had their carpet replaced last Friday. Prep C now has brand new carpet, with splashes of bright colours, which has made a huge impact on this space. The new carpet creates a very fresh and modern look. Carpet tiles have been used, allowing us to replace tiles in high traffic areas in the future. The remaining prep classrooms will have their carpet replaced during the upcoming school holidays. This project was funded with money raised from Art Red Hill.

Our Grade 4 to 6 students have now all completed the Attitudes to School Survey. This annual survey aims to capture student attitudes, opinions and experiences at school and is aligned with the Department's Framework for Improving School Outcomes (FISO). This gives us valuable feedback to help us set goals and where to focus our attention for the future. Last year these results were unpacked with our student leaders, who hosted a student forum to dive deeper into these results. All findings were communicated back to school staff for consideration. This year these results will form part of our school's evidence for our upcoming review.

An important notice was sent home to all families last week, inviting parents to attend a forum to gather parent feedback about teaching and learning, communication, strengths, and areas for improvement in our school. This forum will take place next Tuesday evening commencing at 6:00pm and is expected to go for approximately one hour. We will also run a question and answer session. If you can attend we do ask that you complete and return the RSVP slip.

Teachers have been busy working on their school reports over the past few weeks and are all very close to completion. I would like to thank all of our staff for the efforts they put into these documents. It's been a few years since I wrote my last school reports, but I do remember very clearly how much time goes in to this process. This year we have made the decision to go paperless with our reporting, although hard copies will be printed for all families in Term 3. This decision was made with the impact on the environment in mind. Although this is something new for Red Hill Consolidated School, this is a move most schools have already made. Reports will be made available using the Sentral App.

We have a very busy final three weeks of Term 2. Next week is Enrolment Week. If you or any of your friends have a child ready to start next year and are yet to return an enrolment form, we ask that you do so before Friday the 21st of June. Next week is also Planning Week, which is a great opportunity for teachers to collaboratively plan and prepare with their colleagues for next term. Also on the calendar next week is further professional development for staff on trauma informed practices.

Finally this week, don't forget that our 100 Acts of Kindness Challenge is in full swing. Many of our students are busy sprinkling kindness around the school and at home and we have a large number who are close to completing this challenge. If your child would like to get involved, all they need to do is complete 100 acts of kindness and keep a record of these acts. Students who complete this challenge will receive a kindness wristband and will be recognised at our assembly and on our Kind Kids Club wall in the foyer.
