SIGNING STUDENTS OUT

When signing students out please be aware that our sign out procedure requires anyone picking up a child early to first sign them out at the office where you will be given a slip to take with you to the classroom teacher. Parents are reminded to allow enough time to collect your child from their classroom. These procedures are all in place to keep our students as safe as possible.

ALLERGIES/ANAPHYLAXIS

Recently one of our students with anaphylaxis had a severe reaction at school where an EpiPen was administered. The student was taken to hospital and is now fine. However a near miss like this has prompted us to review our policies and procedures and also remind our community of how serious allergies can be and what we can all do to help.

We strongly urge all families to avoid sending any food to school containing nut products. Please check with your child's classroom teacher if there are any students with allergies or anaphylaxis before sending in food for birthdays or celebrations. Please also speak with your children and ask them not to share food with their friends and encourage them to wash their hands after eating to remove traces of allergens. Although we can never create an allergen free school, we can do our very best to minimise the risks for students with allergies. Thank you for your support in this.

CONGRATULATIONS

Back to some good news, I would like to congratulate Charles from Grade 4, who recently competed at the Karate Pacific Cup in Noumea, representing Australia. Obviously just to make the Australian team has taken Charles years of hard work. He was selected to the team earlier this year and has been training regularly in Sydney.
