Dear Families and Friends,

I hope you all enjoyed the Melbourne Cup public holiday. I would also like to thank all of the families who attended our Halloween Movie Night, last Thursday. The weather was perfect for this event and it seemed like everyone had a good time. This was a really nice evening and it was so great to see the children and some parents in their Halloween costumes. A big thankyou to Tamara Cleine who organised this evening and sold popcorn and choc tops on the night.



Parking is again the hot topic at Red Hill Consolidated School. Most of you are aware that parking signs have changed along Arthurs Seat Road, leaving even fewer parking options for families who drive their children to school. I am currently in regular communication with the Mornington Peninsula Shire and have recently spoken with VicRoads, with plans for all parties to meet on site to discuss possible solutions. As difficult as our parking and traffic situation is, I urge you to be patient and follow the road rules and parking signs around our school. I would also ask all families to use the school crossing rather than calling your children across the road. This is very dangerous, especially during pick up times. To assist reduce the congestion of pick up times, families may also like to:

- Walk or ride to school
- Park a distance from the school and walk
- Use before and aftercare if you need to head off early or you are going to be late.
- Use the school bus services (if eligible)
- Ride share/car pool with other families
- Arrive at 3:40 for pick up. Traffic eases at 3:40 on most afternoons and staff are on duty until 3:45
- Always remain patient and follow road rules and parking signs

I will keep you all updated with any progress on this issue over the coming weeks. Thank you for your cooperation.



Please help your child by developing a routine each night of removing notices from school bags and return notices before the due date. This is an important lesson for our students to learn before secondary college.



Contemporary Learning Experience Update

Over the past few weeks there has been lots of excitement about reading across our school. A massive injection of new books in to our classroom libraries, supported with funds raised through Art Red Hill, has seen our students diving into lots of new titles during Independent Reading time. It has been so rewarding to see students so keen to get their hands on the new books and I never get tired of hearing how happy students are to have beautiful new books in their classrooms. A few students told me that getting the deliveries of new books was 'even better than Christmas!'

Every teacher's goal is to help children become lifelong readers. Teachers work hard planning for reading conferences, guided reading groups, and effective mini-lessons to help lift and push the readers in their classroom. A very valuable tool that teachers must have is the classroom library. The classroom library sends the message to students about what will be valued in a classroom. The classroom library is crucial in helping students develop who they are as readers and have a sense of ownership over their reading.

A well-designed library provides:

- a variety of texts for every reader
- opportunities for students to build stamina and engagement when they have books that are right for them;
- series, authors, and topics that help readers begin to define tastes and preferences;
- books to move to when students are ready for something new to read;
- books to help all readers meet individual goals;
- new releases that allow students to anticipate books as readers;
- accessible books that allow students to think ahead as readers; and
- an organisation that students understand and are able to use independently.

We are in the early stages of developing our classroom libraries and, over the next few years, will work to further develop our collections. As a school community we are so appreciative of the efforts of our parent community in raising the funds, through Art Red Hill, that have allowed us to invest significantly in providing our students with new engaging books.

Staying Sun Smart at Outside School Hours Care

At Outside School Hours Care, the children always enjoy playing outdoors – whether it be group sport activities, playing on the playground or even doing homework with some fresh air. Whatever the activity is, we put utmost importance on the health and safety of the children, so remaining sun smart is always a priority.

Our sun smart policy complies with the SunSmart Guidelines to ensure all children, educators and visitors are protected from over-exposure to UV radiation while maintaining adequate vitamin D levels. Sensible sun protection does not put people at risk of vitamin D deficiency.

UV radiation causes harmful effects on health though we can't see or feel it. Prolonged exposure under the sun's UV can cause sunburn, skin and eye damage, and skin cancer. Protecting your skin from UV exposure is important at any age, but it is particularly important during childhood and adolescence as their skin is vulnerable to damaging sun rays.

To stay sun smart this Summer, children are required to wear their hats during outdoor activities for adequate sun protection. We suggest wide-brimmed hats as these cover the neck, ears and shoulders – these areas are pone sunburn. Apart from hats, children are also advised to wear sunscreen which we provide at our services.


Get ready for a blast of colour!
