Dear Families and Friends.

A great deal has changed since our last newsletter and we are now very excited to be welcoming all students back to on-site learning next Monday. By now you should have received an information guide and a one page key points document on the return to face to face teaching arrangements and processes. We need your continued support to keep our community safe and ensure a smooth transition back to school, so please familiarise yourselves with this information. If you have any further questions, please don't hesitate to email the school account.

### **Swimming Program Term 4**

One of the big decisions for our school was to cancel our swimming program until further notice. Although outdoor pools may operate, this program relies heavily on parent volunteers, who are currently not permitted on site. There are also a number of restrictions and requirements involving changing rooms that would make it impractical to run our swimming program. Swimming will be replaced by weekly physical education lessons. The voluntary contribution for swimming in 2021 has been reduced to compensate for this cancellation.

### 2021 Book Packs, Essential Items and Voluntary Contributions

Information about 2021 book packs, essential items and voluntary contributions will be sent out this week via email from our administration team. Firstly, we would like to apologise for the amount of information in these documents. All provided information is a requirement of the Department of Education's Parent Payment Policy which can be found at <a href="https://www2.education.vic.gov.au/pal/parent-payment/policy">https://www2.education.vic.gov.au/pal/parent-payment/policy</a>. We have made a number of changes for 2021. When constructing year level book packs and essential items, our teachers were mindful that many students will have unused stationary and other items from this year. With that in mind, book packs have been cut back. Head phones have also been made optional for 2021. Book packs will again be delivered to your nominated address this year.

#### **Book Week**

One of the events that was postponed earlier this year was Book Week. This event is always a highlight at RHCS and I am pleased to announce that Book Week has been rescheduled for Week 3 this term with our dress up day on the calendar for Thursday the 22<sup>nd</sup> of October. Please see the attached flyer for more information and details. Start thinking about and organising costumes now. I can't wait.

#### **Upcoming Fire Season**

If you have driven past our school lately, you may have noticed that there has been some significant vegetation removed to ready our school for the upcoming fire danger period. The majority of these works has included the removal of large limbs overhanging buildings and vegetation under our tree canopies. A small number of trees have been removed that were within two meters of a window or flammable material. Further works have been scheduled to comply with the Victorian School Buildings Authority's requirements for schools on the Bushfire At Risk Register. We also have plans to replant with these requirements in mind to maintain our school's leafy appearance.



### **Up to Date Asthma Plans**



As well as the bushfire season just around the corner, we are also approaching the time of year when some children (and adults) experience thunderstorm asthma. With a higher risk of storms on the long range forecast and moderate pollen counts, those in a high risk category, including people who have experienced thunderstorm asthma previously are encouraged to speak with their doctor. It is important that we have up to date asthma action plans and medication for all children with this condition.

On days of high risk, identified students will remain indoors during breaks.

### 2021 Class Planning

We are beginning to make initial plans and preparations for 2021. We are now taking formal requests to assist us develop class lists for next year. Given the disruption to 2020, we plan on making very few changes to classes. However, if you have a friendship request or if there is something specific you believe we should know, please submit your request in writing to the school email account by Friday the 23<sup>rd</sup> of October. No requests will be accepted after this date. We ask that parents do not request certain teachers, as in many cases teachers move year levels from year to year. Instead, please describe the attributes in a teacher that would benefit your child.

As we begin to consider our class structures for next year if there are any families that will not be returning to Red Hill Consolidated School next year would you please either contact the office or email the school to let us know.



### Virtual Art Red Hill 2020







### Come'n try gardening"



### CSEF (Camps, Sport and Excursion Fund) - ELIGIBILITY DATE EXTENDED

The final eligibility date for CSEF in 2020 has been extended from 14th April until 5th October 2020.

Families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply.

### **HOW TO APPLY**

If you applied for CSEF at Red Hill Consolidated school in 2019/2020, you **do not** need to complete another application form, as your application has already been processed. You only need to complete an application form if your child has changed schools in 2020 or you did not apply in 2019/2020.

If you require an application form, please call the school office on 5989 2321. Application forms must be returned by **Friday 27<sup>th</sup> November**, **2020**.

#### CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND ELIGIBILITY

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

### Criteria 1 – Eligibility

To be eligible\* for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or;
- on the first day of Term two.

with one of (a) or (b) above.

- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- \* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx
  Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply

### Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age inclusive. For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

### **Eligibility Date**

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on **28 January 2021**, **14 April 2020 or 5 October** 2020.

### **PAYMENT AMOUNTS**

### **CSEF** payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$62.50 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$112.50 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.
