Contemporary Learning Experience Update

ICAS assessments

A Red Hill Consolidated School we do see reading as a precious gift and as such should celebrate and acknowledge this gift. We are fortunate to have a wealth of reading resources, passionate staff, a strong curriculum connection and growing collections of fiction and non-fiction titles in both our classroom and school libraries. Each and every day is filled with opportunities to expand our reading horizons, whether this is within large or small groups, before school, during breaks, in classrooms, specialist spaces or in warm and cosy reading corners.

Building individual reading skills and habits is so important, as are the benefits children receive from being read to.

As the cleverly named Paige Turner blogged, reading together:

- builds relationships, creating deeper bonds between child and parent;
- provides new experiences, awareness building about the world outside home;
- improves communication, building greater vocabulary, speech patterns and enunciation;
- improved concentration, story time providing an ideal incentive to build concentration; and a lifetime love of books!

After 75 years, it is still so important to continue to celebrate great literature and highlight the importance of reading. Dressing up in costume is only one part of our Book Week celebration at Red Hill. Before and during Book week we also explore the shortlisted texts, encouraging students to choose a favourite and explain their choice. Our students describe the character that they dress as and highlight their characteristics. Unfortunately, this year we can't have our traditional parade due to Covid-19 restrictions but we are looking forward to our virtual assembly. Many thanks to Mrs Stacey Dempster for coordinating our Book Week celebrations this year.
