Contemporary Learning Experience Update

At the end of this term, parents will receive Semester 2 academic reports for their children. These reports are going to be significantly different to those that you have received in the past. The Department of Education has advised that, due to schools adopting revised teaching and learning plans for all of Term 3 and the first week of Term 4, reports should be modified. This Semester teachers will be providing the following:

- A description of the areas of the English and Mathematic curriculum taught.
- A succinct comment describing student learning achievement and possible next steps in learning for English and Mathematics.
- A balanced, evidence based and holistic judgement about where a student is located on the continuum of learning in English and Mathematics. These progression points will also show the growth students have achieved over the past 12 months.
- A personal comment about the students as a learner. Teachers may refer to how students adjusted to remote learning in this comment.
- Judgement of 'Personal and Social Development', communicated through a checklist.
- An overview of the curriculum covered for Science, PE, Art and Japanese and a skills checklist.

Reports will be published electronically through Sentral and, closer to the date of publication, information will be sent home about how to access these reports. If you are not set up to access Sentral, please contact administration and they will assist you.
