



I would like to sincerely thank our residing school council members, beginning with our fearless school council president, Naomi Douglas. Naomi has been a long standing school council member and the school council president for the past two years. In this role, Naomi has been of wonderful support to the RHCS school community, including heavy involvement in the 2019 school review and the principal selection process in 2020. In addition to these duties, Naomi has provided guidance and support during both periods of remote and flexible learning and the capital works project.

I would also like to thank Jeff Green for his time, contributions and input over his two year term of office. Jeff brought valuable expertise and knowledge to school council and our facilities sub-committee.

And finally, I thank Kim Clarkson who has served as the DET employee representative for as long as anyone can remember. On behalf of the entire school community I would like to thank each of these residing members for for their commitment to improve our beautiful school.

Last week we received confirmation that we were successful in our application for the Greener Government School Buildings (GGSB) solar program. As part of this program, RHCS will be receiving a **21.83kW** solar power system at a total estimated investment of **\$27,876.42**. This is a wonderful result for our community, shifting some of our energy consumption to a clean power source. Both the gymnasium roof and new modular buildings are being considered for this system. The expected completion date for this project is June this year. Very exciting!



I've noticed that a number of students are currently coming to school out of uniform. Wearing school uniform is important for many reasons and builds pride with schools. I have spoken about this at assembly recently and have since followed up with individual students who are out of uniform. This has not been an issue in my time at RHCS and we need your support in ensuring all children are in full school uniform. One of the reasons for this seems to be that many children are misplacing items of clothing at school. Please label all uniform and check lost property if you are missing anything. We are constantly reminding our students to show our school value of responsibility by picking up their jumpers at the end of our recess and lunchtime breaks. Thanks in advance for your support in this issue.

Unfortunately I don't have any progress to share with you regarding our parking and traffic. However, we currently have a number of vacancies on our school bus services. Using our school buses is one way to avoid the chaos of pick up and drop off, and also reduces traffic congestion during these peak times. While I'm on the topic of buses, just a quick reminder to all families who are already using our buses, please keep us up to date with your child's travel schedule. If your circumstances change due to sporting or after school commitments, please inform office staff. Can I also remind all parents that it is an expectation that an adult is waiting at the bus stop each afternoon. This is especially important for our younger students, given that many of our bus stops are located on dangerous and busy roads.

This week we held a small ceremony in our school hall to present our Grade 6 Leaders with their Badges. It was so nice to welcome parents to this event and I would like to thank our local member, Chris Brayne for presenting badges to these students. I am looking forward to working closely with our School Captains, Specialist Captains and Student Voice Team Presidents in 2021. The next exciting event for our Grade 6 team is our upcoming circus production. These students have been training hard since the first week back this year and will be performing their skills and talents in week 10 this term. I can't wait.




