

From the Principal

Dear parents and carers,

It is hard to believe that we are now over half way through our school year. Term 3 had gotten off to a smooth start at Red Hill Consolidated with students and teachers straight back into Unfortunately just as we got settled into the routine of the new school term, we were thrown back into a lockdown.

However, our staff, students and parents flipped into remote learning overnight. I would like to thank our teachers for the work behind the scenes to ensure that the transition to remote learning was so seamless. Many thanks also to our parents and our amazing learners who showed great resilience and positivity during the period of lockdown.

Current Restrictions

Despite being allowed to return to school there are a number of restrictions in place under the current Operations Guide issued by the Department of Education. At present only school staff and 'essential visitors' are allowed to be on school grounds. 'Essential visitors' include preservice teachers on placement from university, health professionals or tradespeople completing necessary works.

We are asking for our parent community to support us in abiding by the guidelines by not coming onto school grounds unless necessary. Parents must wear their masks when on school grounds and should not be congregating. If parents are dropping children off late or picking children up early, we ask that they come to the administration office. Please

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check in using the QR code on the door before you enter. The administration staff will then organise for your child to be escorted to or from the classroom.

Unfortunately the present guidelines do not allow us to have any incursions and also prevent our instrumental teachers from providing lessons onsite. However excursions and camps are allowed to go ahead.

Capital Works Project Update

At present the new build is progressing well. The builders are currently working on preparing the formwork for the suspended slab, which will hopefully be poured at the beginning of August. In the next edition of our newsletter I will include some pictures of the project's progress. It is exciting to watch the building develop and we can't wait to get students into this new learning space in 2022.

Parent Opinion Survey

Each Red Hill family is encouraged to participate in the Parent Opinion Survey which is now open. The opinions of our parents and carers are important to us and will contribute to the future management and organisation of our school. The survey takes approximately 20 minutes to complete and all families will have received information on accessing the survey via email.

Recycling at RHCS

Our Eco bins are now in operation and we have started educating our students on how to reduce and sort their waste. You can help us out at home by sending rubbish free lunches, or lunches with limited packaging. To get us started, we will have the capacity to recycle paper and cardboard as well as type 1 and 6 plastics and milk and juice cartons. We would appreciate if you could avoid using soft plastics such as chip packages, muesli bar wrappers and cling wrap when packing lunches. Hopefully your children will be able to help with alternatives to using these plastics in lunchboxes. We are hoping to drastically reduce the amount of waste we are sending to landfill by reducing and sorting our waste more efficiently. To do this, we will need your assistance.

Remote Learning 5.0



Luckily our teachers created some fantastic learning opportunities for our students to engage in and still feel connected to our Red Hill community. The response from parents and students alike has been overwhelmingly positive, with a wonderful mix of humour, challenging tasks and Webex malfunctions!



And let's not forget our learners! Our children have once again proven that they can survive and thrive when in Lockdown with some incredible work samples (sometimes a little difficult to read when submitted online! Hahaha) and fantastic attendance at our morning Webex meetings and Live lessons. I think our students now have a good understanding of the 'mute' button and the chat feature!



We have definitely seen students manage their own learning with reduced reliance on adults in the house, a wonderful growth point for our learners as a result of Remote Learning. And let's not forget the advances many students have made in their ability to apply technology to their learning!



Our Contemporary Learning Experience is centred around student engagement. ADMIN UPDATE

CSEF (Camps, Sport and Excursion Fund) - ELIGIBILITY DATE EXTENDED

The eligibility date for CSEF in 2021 has been extended from 19th April until 12th July 2021.

Families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply.

HOW TO APPLY

If you applied for CSEF at Red Hill Consolidated school in 2020/2021, you **do not** need to complete another application form, as your application has already been processed. You only need to complete an application form if your child has changed schools in 2021 or you did not apply in 2020/2021.

If you require an application form, please call the school office on 5989 2321. Application forms must be returned by **Friday 13**th **August, 2021.**

CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND ELIGIBILITY

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 – Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or;
- on the first day of Term two, or
- on the first day of Term three
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- * A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on **27 January 2021**, **19 April 2021**, or **12 July 2021**.

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$62.50 half yearly rate
- Secondary school student rate: \$112.50 half yearly rate

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.
