

Dear families and friends,

I hope you are all well and were not impacted by the recent severe weather. I am sure all of our thoughts are with those families that have been affected by the flooding in many areas throughout Victoria. We escaped the rain and weather lightly up here at school, although with more such weather events on the long range forecast, it is a timely reminder that some of our students may experience thunderstorm asthma over the next few weeks. Thunderstorm asthma is caused by the combination of ryegrass pollen allergy during springtime thunderstorms and children who suffer from hay fever or asthma are at a higher risk. If your child is susceptible to thunderstorm asthma, please let the school know and ensure we have up to date medications and management plans. In accordance with Department of Education advice, on days where thunderstorm asthma is forecast as high, students at risk will be kept indoors during recess and lunch breaks.

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We are also fast approaching the Fire Danger Period. Although the risk of bushfires is low this year, we are already starting to prepare for this period by removing vegetation around our buildings and evacuation routes and keeping our grasses cut short. Our students and staff recently rehearsed our evacuation procedures with another drill scheduled for later this term. As you may be aware, the Victorian Fire Ratings have changed this year to a four point scale. With Red Hill Consolidated School being on the Bushfire At Risk Register, our school will be closed on days categorised as Catastrophic.

Again, the risk of a school closure is very unlikely and in fact has not occurred since the introduction of Code Red Days. If the school is closed or we are required to evacuate, parents will be contacted via SMS and updated via emails.



This week our tickets went live for Golf Red Hill. All families should have received an email with information on how to purchase tickets. If you are interested, please get in early as tickets are limited. We are still looking for local businesses interested in a hole sponsorship. This is sure to be another excellent community event. A big thank you to the Golf Red Hill organisers; Simon Butterworth, James Date and Kathryn Eagle.

This is a new camp for our students, which more closely aligns to our Learning Explorations.
