



Courage to Care Incursion: Upstander Program

On the 4th of April, Year 5 and 6 had a visit from Courage to Care, we were bubbling with excitement when the presenters walked through our door! Some of us have donated a gold coin to say thank you. We started our first activity, based on stereotypes, prejudice discrimination and racism. We needed to match the description card with the meaning card. Following this, we had to to choose a side of the room where there was a sign, with either discrimination, prejudice, racism or stereotype, we had to choose which meaning best represented the image that was shown. We also spoke about a picture of a classroom scenario where there were two girls whispering about their peers and two boys were observing. We talked about how they could have been upstanders and we all came up with amazing ideas. A presenter put up a photo of a community from World War II- we identified the victims, a man with a weapon was described as a perpetrator and people in the background as bystanders - some were probably upstanders too- it was hard to tell. A presentation was then given on an Aunt who survived the Holocaust due to the act of upstanders. She was also the oldest person to survive Covid. As Courage to Care were leaving, they kindly gave us a band saying "Upstander" to remind us that we can always be upstanders and to act in a safe way. This can be done in small ways to help others including telling a trusted adult to help. All our students have identified adults in the school they trust to speak with and ask for help with difficult situations. Dish out some help

Did you know more than 120 dedicated local volunteers deliver around 75,000 meals across the Mornington Peninsula every year?

The Meals on Wheels Service delivers nutritious meals to residents who are unable to provide for their personal dietary needs.

Meals may consist of soup, a main meal and dessert. A vitamin C supplement is also provided in the form of fruit juice or a piece of fruit.

The wonderful team at the Shire's Food Services Kitchen in Rosebud prepare all meals and they are delivered by a volunteer workforce across the peninsula to clients each weekday morning.

A delivery from Meals on Wheels is much more than just a meal, for many clients it is the highlight of their day and, in some cases, may be one of very few interactions during the week.

The team urgently needs more volunteers to help deliver this essential service in the Rosebud area.
