

CLE UPDATE

On Monday, May 22nd and Wednesday, May 24th we will be holding our 'Strengthening Learning Partnership' conferences. These conferences were previously known as Three-way Conferences and provide an authentic opportunity for students to share their growth as a learner. This opportunity involves a 10-minute conversation in which teachers, parents and students discuss student strengths and areas for future learning

growth. They are a collaborative discussion that involves age-appropriate shared leadership of the conversation; however it remains the responsibility of the teacher to ensure significant and meaningful content is shared.

Conferences involving the student, parents and teacher are used in schools all around the world and are recognised as highly beneficial to the learning process. They are also extremely beneficial as they allow for a shared celebration of student learning growth and provide a student voice to discussions about progress and targets. A central goal of our Contemporary Learning Experience is for the learning to be Student Centred and for students to take ownership of their learning and develop independence. The 'Strengthening Learning Partnership' Conferences are a significant and critical part of this process. We understand that at times there are critical pieces of confidential information that parents need to share with the classroom teacher and they would like to ensure this is done so without the child involved. If you require further time with the teacher, we ask that you arrange a follow up phone conversation or meeting with the teacher.

At Red Hill we have placed the conferences in the middle of Term 2 to ensure that you receive regular feedback about student progress and don't have to wait until the end of June for an update. Bookings for the Strengthening Learning Partnership Conferences will be made using Compass. Information on how to book conferences will be sent out, via email, this Friday.

How to keep our young children safe online- an invaluable information session for all parents of all young people

Susan McLean is Australia's foremost expert in the area of cyber safety and was a member of Victoria Police for 27 years. Widely known as the 'cyber cop' she was the first Victoria Police Officer appointed to a position involving cyber safety and young people. In 2003 she was the Victoria Police Region Four Youth Officer of the Year.

Susan is unique in her vast knowledge and expertise in this area and is the only person in Australia with her specific background, experience and qualifications. She is a sought-after presenter and advisor and has delivered keynote presentations, written papers and regularly provides professional development for those working in education and other key youth stakeholders on a global level. She works with students in the classroom and provides engaging parent education sessions. Susan provides consultancy services to a range of organisations including government and non-government bodies, adolescent psychologists, magistrates, sporting bodies, corporate entities, law firms, mental health bodies and Medical Practitioners.

"Kids need to appreciate and accept that just as in the real world, there are dangers in cyberspace. Parents need to teach kids that cyberspace is permanent. Everything that they write, post and send can be traced and will remain there forever. Do they want that comment, or pic from Saturday night's party on the desk of the person conducting a job interview in 10 years time? Are you happy for that naked pic, sent trustingly to their boyfriend who loves

them dearly and will not share it with anyone (until he has it or you break up or both) on the computer of a paedophile? Kids need to think before they click and parents and teachers need to educate them to ensure that where possible, the correct decisions are made in the first instance, not after a moment of madness."

Interschool Equestrian State Championships


On April 15-18 Macey and Bella represented the school at the Victorian Interschool State Championships over at Werribee Park National Equestrian Center. Bella placed 1^{st} and 2^{nd} in her two Dressage tests taking out 1^{st} place in the Championship for her class! Bella also placed 6^{th} in the Primary Combined Training, 10^{th} in Bending and 9^{th} in Barrel Racing.

Macey, riding a horse she had only been riding for 2 weeks, placed 4th, 6th and 8th in each of her Show Jumping competitions which placed her 6th overall in the Show Jumping Championship, just missing out on advancing though to the National Championship! Macey also finished 10th in the Primary 80cm Combined Training and 12th and 15th in each of her Dressage tests.


Out of over 150 Primary competitors Bella's individual results combined to place her 14th and Macey placed 29th overall. Bella and Macey' results placed the school in 73rd position out of over 180 schools across Victoria. An amazing placing! We are so proud of you both and your amazing horses.
