#### **Important Bus Changes**

All bus travellers received an email last week seeking volunteers to move to the Point Leo Service. We would love to hear from families willing to shift services if convenient. Please call the office on 59892321 if you are able to assist.



Our Point Leo AM service times will change slightly starting next term. All stops will move 5 minutes later. If your child uses the Point Leo service, please be aware of this change in times.

Please also be aware of your child's eligibility for bus travel, which was made clear in your annual application. In particular, conditional travellers (those who live within 4.8km of the school) may only access bus travel if there is a seat available. Priority is given to eligible travellers. This means that conditional travellers may be required to relinquish their seat in some situations. Unfortunately, this was the case last week on our Shoreham Bus service. Rest assured, we do our very best to avoid these circumstances and have worked hard on an alternative for these travellers to continue to use a bus service. If you did receive this communication last week, we would appreciate a reply to confirm your child's travel arrangements for next term.

#### **Upcoming Important Dates**

With just one full week of school remaining, please be aware of a few important dates. Firstly, students will be dismissed on Friday the 23<sup>rd</sup> of June at normal 3:30pm finishing time. Buses and TheirCare will run as normal on the last day of term. Students return for Term 3 on Monday the 10<sup>th</sup> of July. # No-Go-Tell Create-A-Poster Activity


The wellbeing team would like to invite all our students to create a NO GO TELL A4 or A3 poster to be displayed in our school. These can be drawn, painted, created on computer or collaged- we can't wait to see some fantastic ideas.

No- Ask the person to stop what they are doing. Let them know you don't like it!

Go- If it continues, leave the person or place and go to a different place to play.

Tell-Tell a teacher or a trusted adult if the behaviour continues.

Please encourage your children to use and also practice these words and strategies in a safe environment, giving them a chance to feel more confident with this approach when in an uncomfortable or disrespectful space. If there is repeated teasing or disrespectful behaviour, please encourage your child to let a teacher know or contact their classroom teacher directly. Disrespectful actions and bullying behaviour has no place in our school and we all need to work together to educate our students and stop these incidents. # LAST CHANCE! CSEF (Camps, Sport and Excursion Fund) APPLICATIONS CLOSING

# CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below is the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF). **Criteria 1 – Eligibility** 

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or nongovernment Victorian primary or secondary school must:

on the first day of Term one, or;

 $\hfill\square$  on the first day of Term two;

a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the *State Concessions Act 2004*, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;

c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/csef Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

#### Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

#### **Eligibility Date**

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (31 January 2023) or term two (24<sup>th</sup> April 2023).

### HOW TO APPLY

If you applied for the CSEF at Red Hill Consolidated school in 2022, you do not need to complete an application form in 2022 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

□ new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2023 or you did not apply in 2022.

□ changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2023.

If you require an application form, please call the school office on 5989 2321. Application forms must be returned by **Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> June, 2023**.
