Before and After School Supervision

I've noticed that an increasing number of children are being dropped off at school well before 8:45am and picked up after 3:45pm in the afternoons. Students are not supervised outside of these hours. Currently, our arrangements for students not collected by 3:45pm is that they are sent to the office, where parents are contacted. Our office can be quite busy with uncollected students some afternoons, making it very disruptive for our administration staff. I encourage all families to register for TheirCare, our Out of School Hours Care provider, and use this service if you need to get off early in the mornings or if you are going to be late in the afternoon. Many families are eligible for subsidised rates to use TheirCare. Please visit their website (https://theircare.com.au) for information on fees and how to register. 
