Bushfire At Risk Register

As we approach summer it is also time to prepare for the threat of bushfire. As many of you would know, RHCS is on the Bushfire At Risk Register (BARR). Being on this register means that we take additional precautions and establish measures to reduce this risk that bushfires present. In addition, all schools and early childhood services listed on the BARR will close when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast in their fire weather district. Families will be contacted by text and email if a day of Catastrophic fire danger is declared. In this instance, no one can be on the school grounds, all excursions and camps will be cancelled and our bus services will be suspended. This is another reason why it is essential that we have accurate contact details for our families. Camps

Our Grade 6 students are on camp enjoying the first big event of their final term of Primary school, developing their social skills, teamwork, and independence at Waratah Beach.

Our Grade 5 and 3 students will also head off to camp this term.

Camps can be a time of fun and friendship-building. Getting away from the classroom for a few days and trying your hand at new activities can be so enjoyable. But not for everyone. For many, the fun of camp is overshadowed by concerns. While some students may bound off to camp with barely a backward glance, many children will need extra help to see past their worries to the fun beyond.

Common concerns about camp

- Sleeping away from home in an unfamiliar place
- Responsibility for self-care, in the absence of parents
- Who they will share a room with at camp.
- If they will like the food at camp

Feeling homesick or lonely

These are all very natural concerns for a child, whether it is their first or tenth time at camp. The good news is that there are many things that we can do as parents in the lead-up to camp time that can help our child enjoy the camp experience.

Firstly, knowing why camps are such a great experience for your child is good. Besides all the fun things that will happen at camp, there are also many opportunities for growth and development of skills, such as:

- Social and teamwork skills, as children connect across the entire year level.
- Skills of independence, as children take more responsibility for their self-care.
- Practical life skills as they engage in a range of activities.

Building resilience and self-confidence as they overcome challenges.

So, what practical steps can you take to prepare your child for camp so they can benefit from all that camp has to offer?

Practice sleepovers

Your child is much more likely to feel positively about sleeping away from home if they have had success doing so in the past. Arrange sleepovers at a friend or relative's house in the lead-up to camp time and continue until your child is confident in their ability to sleep well when away from home and Mum and Dad.

Make packing fun.

Let your child be responsible for planning, gathering and checking off items needed for camp. If things need to be purchased, turn it into a fun shopping trip. Having your child pack their bag also ensures they know what is in it and where to find things.

Pack something special

It may comfort your child to take a special little something, a soft toy, a photo of family or a little note you wrote. Whatever may help ease the separation is perfectly fine. If needed, mention this to your child's teacher so they know what is being taken along.

Talk to the teacher.

Talk to their teacher if there is anything of particular concern for your child or you. It may even pay to write a note about specific problems or things your child would like their teacher to remember while at camp. Remember, teachers are likely to have taken many children to camp in the past and are best placed to help alleviate concerns.

Be positive.

Positively talk about camp. Tell your child that you think they are ready for camp — point out practical things they can do for themselves. Keep talking about the fun experiences of camp and let them know how much you look forward to hearing about camp when they return.

Your child will go on many school camps throughout their years of school. Hopefully, these tips will help make camp a happy, enjoyable time for your child.
